2. Police report: Five officers attended from the Roseville. (See names under “Guests”). They came to address two primary areas of crime in our area; break-ins (door kick-ins) and metal thefts (copper in the form of catalytic converters and wiring). They identified what the police is doing and what, as neighbors, we can do.

Police Response: Captain Moore noted that the biggest trend is no longer break-ins but the current rise of metal theft. He lives near some of the homes which had been broken into. When eight perpetrators were caught, the word got out and consequently the number of these types of crimes decreased.

The police are using analysis of the specific data to send out specialized units to help with patrolling. In response to a specific question, we were told these break-ins are not part of organized crime activity. The door kicks and other forms of break-ins are crimes of opportunity.

Q: Are these types of break-ins intended to intimidate the homeowner? **A:** Possibly.

Q: What are the police doing systematically to end this crime wave, for example a visible versus invisible presence? **A:** At a patrol level unmarked as well as marked vehicles are used.

Q: The question was what is done specifically in our neighborhood? What resources are being allocated? **A:** There is a major task force for the metal theft. Also there is a multi-agency task force being created for the break-in activity. As a consequence a lot of people have been caught. But, the emphasis was consistently on success being a product of neighborhood involvement, us.

As for the door kickers, etc. these are not violent crimes. They don't want to break in and find someone there. Let those who are at the door know someone is home. There have been no reports of anyone being injured.

The primary cause of the break-ins is the need for drug money. This means the individuals are not interested in violence but getting in and getting out. Often these individuals are already in the area because Maidu park, West Colonial park, and similar areas are used as hangouts for drug users.

Neighborhood Responsibility: The first area to look at is home protection. Safety can be created by a security door. When doors are kicked in what breaks is the frame or the center of the door not dead bolts, locks or hinges giving way. Alarm the house. Dogs can be helpful.

Homeowners should vary their routine, move cars around, and/or use different interior lights. The idea is to make sure the home looks occupied. It is especially important to either have exterior lights on throughout the night and/or have motion detector lighting.

The second area of responsibility is how neighbors need to look out for one another. For example, when hearing an alarm ringing at a neighbor's house, call the police.

We need to be eyes and ears for the police. If something looks suspicious contact police. Get license plate numbers, and if possible vehicle make, model, and color. Take a picture of vehicle. What the police need most from citizens is that they are good witnesses. **Be alert and report.**

Another point that was emphasized was that every homeowner should record the serial numbers for everything in their homes and email it to themselves. This helps the police if they suspect they are viewing stolen merchandise and the homeowner in dealing with their insurance company.

Q: What are the rights of the homeowner when it comes to protecting themselves inside their homes. **A:** They have the right to do what is needed to protect themselves and their children (but only if the perpetrator is actually inside the house).

Q: One individual asked/suggested that neighbors to "set up a sting." This was based on the fact that break-ins often occur within a day or two of a homeowner leaving taking a boat or RV that is normally sitting in front of the house. **A:** The police made it very clear they would not give their "blessing" to a "sting" operation because of the risk involved. It also isn't really necessary because someone is always leaving on vacation so the neighbors need to be aware of what is going on around them. Again what is important here is to **be alert and report.**

Q: What about home solicitors. They are required to have an ID, an official company badge, and a city permit.. Second if the homeowner has a "No Soliciting" sign, even if solicitors have a permit, they cannot come to your door. You can call the police for non-permitted solicitors.
