The Summer Reading Program is for ages 0-adult. **Novelist and www.arbookfind.com** can help you find books to support your child's reading levels. Library staff is available to assist getting you started in any and all these areas by e-mail www.roseville.ca.us/library or call 774-5221.

The library has a large collection of audio books, DVD'S, music, and a growing collection of non-fiction youth books. Investigate your local library through the Roseville computer catalog. Don't forget you can reserve books by going to **www.roseville.ca.us/library** then choose 'find a book' on the left-hand menu books/ titles, authors, subjects plus look among the new acquisitions listed in books, audio books, DVD's, e-books. To reserve you will need a library card and PIN; you will be e-mailed or called (your choice) when your items have arrived. Use the library website for more up-to-date offerings, i.e. classes, events, and clubs. While there explore all the tabs to see what's available in each section.

Learning Express: a database providing an online learning environment filled with practice tests such as standardized testing, ACT, and SAT. Tutorial course series for elementary-high school students include: math, and reading for elementary grades; and branches out to include social studies, writing and high school prep exams in middle school years; then, science, logic and reasoning, statistics, trigonometry, vocabulary and writing for high school. Adult **practice exams** in the fields of: air traffic controller, civil service, commercial driver's license, cosmetology, culinary arts, electrical, emergency medical services, firefighter, green careers, law enforcement, military, nursing and allied health care, legal, plumbing, real estate, teaching, college placement, and U.S. Citizenship. You will also find popular **software tutorials**, **job search, and workplace skills**, information on jobs, careers, and skill building for adults. Log on to **www.roseville.ca.us/library**, then choose *online databases* on the left hand menu, followed by *Learning Express* (tip: registration is required on your initial visit) need help call 774-5221.
