- 5. Police Report: Suspected empty-house sentinel (guy on bike texting). This appears to be reconnaissance for break-ins. There were reports of three separate incidents on watch mail. Ken said they also reported someone doing texting in front of a vacant house. He was on rollerblades. These individuals are handing out fliers for different business services and may be using this as a way to scope out houses. (20 25 years of age.)

Has been an increase in Catalytic thefts again. Recommended an article for the news letter headed "Burglary Prevention." When a neighbor sees something suspicious provide as much detail as possible. Phone photos can be sent as email to the police.


- **6.** RCONA report:
 - a. The RCONA Candidates Forum will be on September 11^{th} at the Martha Riley Library from 7:00 9:00 PM
 - b. Sammy Hager will be opening his restaurant September 15th. This will be a major event in downtown.
 - c. The Police Citizens Academy is being held from September 17th through the 27th. (see City website for details.).
 - d. Crime Stoppers "Sauce Off" event will be held on September 21st.
 - e. The Med Take Back Day is September 29th and will be held at Oakmont High School from 10:00 AM 2:00 PM.
 - f. Light Blub Exchange: Bring 10 old style bulbs and exchange for 10 CFLs. This is being held at the Utilities Exploration Center next to the Martha Riley Library.

- 7. Library Report: (see attached). Fran attended a library task force session that was intended to gather information identifying three target areas for improvement next year. The session she attended identified the Library computer system was an area needed improving; there needs to be improvement in interfacing with the community providing information on what programs, services, etc. are available through the library; the last area is to increase awareness of the floating collection.
- 8. Old Business:
 - a. Elections: Lance Hibben offered himself for a board position. His name will be added to the slate for the September meeting.
 - b. NNO: The event well. Three quarters of the ice cream was used. There were approximately 50 people who showed up. Lance thought the local park was probably a better choice than using Maidu Regional because it was a bit more intimate.
- 9. New Business:
 - a. Donation Ideas: Because we run a surplus in our account, it has been suggested we donate some of it while making sure we maintain a large enough reserve to cover the newsletter if we lose a sponsor. The amount suggest is approximately a third of the balance.

The board decided on three items on the library wish list to evaluate: CD shelves, updating the furniture in the children's area; TV monitor. We want to make sure there is some kind of label/sign, etc. on whatever we donate that identifies the item being paid for by the association. We will take any additional suggestions at the September meeting. It was also suggested some of the money be used for neighborhood signs (see next item).

- b. Neighborhood Signs: Jim will look into costs and city requirements. Depending on costs these could either come out of the money suggested in the previous item or handled as a separate item as being an actual association cost. These signs are intended to identify the area included in the Maidu Neighborhood Association.
- c. Park Cleanup Planning: The cleanup will be on October 27th. It will run from 10:00-12:00. Lance will oversee the event with Jim helping out. It has been suggested we include West Colonial open space at the same time and this seems to be the best approach. The ability to do both areas will depend on the number if individuals coming out.
