2. Sign in/Welcome

3. Elections of Officers: All board members agreed to stay in their existing positions. Geoff moved that positions remain as currently filled.

Motion BM 09/12-1: Approved.

4. Special Presentation: Placer County Supervisor, Kirk Uhler:

- a. Mr. Uhler started by noting that he is now representing more of the city of Roseville after the last redrawing of district lines. We are included in his district. He and his Field Rep., Linda Brown, are making an effort to speak to the neighborhood associations.
- b. Regarding services in Roseville and Placer County, Mr Uhler pointed out there is overlap for some of them. Examples include: arrests made by city police are put in county jails, tried in county courts, and overseen by the county probation department. The District Attorney and Sheriffs Departments are in the county. The county also handles health and human services issues. Any questions in these area can be directed to him personally, or Ms. Brown.
- c. Placer County is staying well within it's budget. The current budget has decreased by 3.5% over the prior year and two million dollars has gone into reserves.
- d. One troubling area which may affect future budgets in the county is "Realignment." This

is the state turn over of certain responsibilities to the counties without providing adequate additional funding. One area is to turn prisoners at the state level to the county while only providing 25% of the dollars the state was spending. Fortunately Placer has been handling the problem. These are the nonviolent prisoners based on last incarceration. The county does have desecration over the length of incarceration time with these prisoners.

- e. Another area of overlap between city and county is tied to the Regional Development Plan, (see below). This includes the Lincoln Bypass which is scheduled to open October 5th. This opens access to the Lincoln Airport giving more access to South Placer. (see attached)
- f. Placer County Regional Development Plan. The “Blue Print” includes plans for development of further urbanization. The county also identified the same area of West Placer for urbanization as the “Blue Print.” The City of Roseville is not participating the plan though Mr. Uhler suggests it probably will join at some point. In response to a question Mr. Uhler expanded on why there is “swamp land” behind the Galleria. The land was spoiled because there was no consistent plan pointing to one of the future benefits of the “Blue Print.”
- g. In response to a question regarding transportation routes Mr. Uhler noted that all these plans, including future ones, are part of the “Blue Print.” The next in line is the Placer Parkway. The lead in each project depends on the project itself, i.e.: Placer County is the lead and is working with the three cities, Roseville, Lincoln, and Rocklin. Then all the appropriate agencies requirements and acts must be met. Caltrans has been the lead on the Lincoln Bypass. On I80 (a Federal Highway) the Feds are the lead.
- h. Mr. Uhler sits on the Roseville committee looking into bringing one or more four year universities to the City. The committee has reached the point in the process where work is beginning on contacting specific groups/universities.

7. Fire Department Report:

- a. The numbers of calls have increased of late especially at the Eureka station. These calls are primarily medical in nature.
- b. Station 9 is being built at the west end of Roseville.
- c. Because new funding sources fifteen positions and promotions are being filled/made. Stations which previously experienced personal cuts will have these positions restored from the new hires. The exact numbers may be a bit flexible
- d. The 911 service is being revamped to provide faster response time.
- e. Emergency response, types of vehicles, numbers of individuals etc. was addressed based on a question from the floor.

8. Treasurer’s report: Beginning August Balance: \$2,190.71 Ending September Balance: \$2,190.71

9. RCONA report:

- a. The September 11th Candidate Forum was a success. It will be shown on the RCONA YouTube TV feed. It is also available as a DVD for a \$5 donation to RCONA

- b. The Santa in the Park date is December 8th-9th.
- c. The Meadow Oaks Neighborhood Association will be having a Creek Restoration Day (Linda Creek) on October 13th.

10. Library Report: The library will be having it's 100th Anniversary "Family Day" Celebration October 20th Noon to 4:00 PM." This will be held at the downtown library.

11. Old Business:

- a. Donation Ideas: Jim spoke to the city regarding neighborhood signs. There was a bit of discussion. Jim will go back to the city with a question regarding poles. Ken is still gathering information regarding the building of a CD cabinet for the Library.
- b. Park Cleanup: The scheduled date is October 27th. Lance noted that the West Colonial Parkway residents are being asked to join and handle the open area by them. Then they are invited to come back to Maidu for the lunch. To increase participation there will be a competition for the biggest percentage and number of participants from each area as well as a prize for the most unusual trash. Lance will be designing a flier for the West Colonial people. He also offered to speak this group regarding safety, etc. Mary will contact Leatherbys asking them to provide certificates for sundaes. The same food will be provided as in prior years. Lance suggested the Boy Scouts to join us.

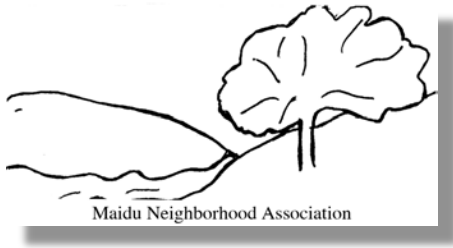
12. New Business:

Subject: Possible changes to RCONA NA boundaries

Pursuant to request of the City of Roseville, Jamie Carlson asked RCONA to help facilitate with updates to the current RCONA Neighborhood Association boundaries.

Special consideration was given to:

1. Combine NAs to enhance NA formations (enable small NAs to combine resources), keep to approximately 1,500 homes each (Jamie will provide housing figures)
2. Combine NAs with similar needs (housing type, facilities, etc.)
3. Geographic locations—keep neighbors close within key geographic areas
4. Incorporate industrial and commercial areas with active NAs (promote business sponsorships and incorporate small residence groups)
5. Keep changes within police beats to a minimum (Jamie said police beats were designed to coincide with the current RCONA NA map, but fire districts are not connected).

Jamie, Sue, and Jim met on September 7th, and the first suggested revisions (in Map Draft 1) were presented to the E-Board on September 13th where several more revisions were added. Subject to the approval of the subject active NAs and the City of Roseville (police included), the following chart details the suggested recommendations (proceeding from South East corner to North West corner of NA Map]:

7.	#37 Stanford combine with #39 Stanford Crossing.	Beat 5 – No change

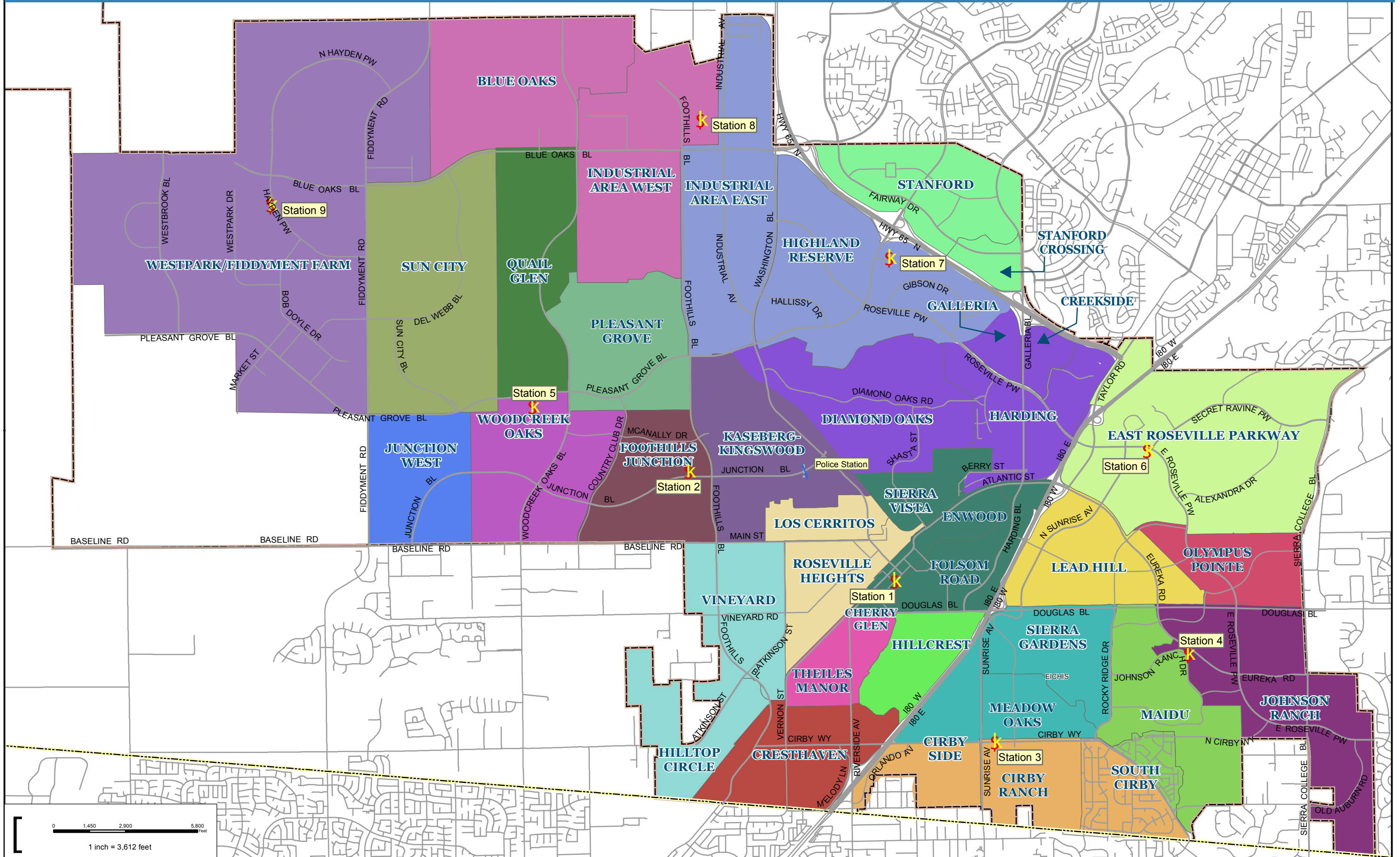
Discussed for future change (but not within next year): Divide #42 WestPark – Fiddyment Farm into 3 areas by main geographic boundaries:

- A) north of Blue Oaks,
- B) between Blue Oaks and south to Pleasant Grove,
- C) south of Pleasant Grove and west of WestPark Drive.
