2. Sign in/Welcome:

3. Police Report:

- a. Officer Helliwell reported an increase in break-ins along our corridor tied to beat 1, (Galleria).
- b. He warned against leaving anything in the cars when shopping. Make sure not to put stuff in the trunk where one can be observed. Smash and grab is a crime of opportunity.
- c. Don't leave a purse in a shopping cart unintended because things are being taken out of them. Also distracters may be used while someone steals from the purse. Teams are also using the distraction routine against the elderly in their homes. One person will distract and draw the homeowner to the outside while the other quickly goes into the house and grabs what they can.
- d. Concern was expressed about packages being taken from the front door. It was suggested to make arrangements with UPS, USPS, and FedEx to not leave packages but a note to arrange for pickup.
- e. The officer reinforced the need to be aware of the neighborhood, get to know your neighbors, and report anything suspicious.

4. Minutes of previous meeting: David A. moved, Vicki seconded, approved.

5. Treasurer's report: The beginning November balance is \$2,076.63. The ending balance is \$2,076.63.

6. RCONA report: None because their meeting is later in this week.

7. Library Report (see attached):
 - a. Pronunciator: This is a new program allowing access to 80 languages.
 - b. December 17-19: Free Maidu Museum Pass. There will be guided tours at 10:00 AM and children's activities.

8. Old Business:
 - a. KKAD25 Stickers: David A, Scott, Shirley, Jim, and Vicki will be meeting on the 27th to put them up. They will meet at South Cirby and Champion Oaks at 7:30 AM.
 - b. Park burn area update: Vicki reported that there has been a crew of three taking all kinds of data on every tree, measuring, etc. and inputting it into computers. The pipes were all pulled last week. A lot of trees were removed from McLaren and Park Hill. They will be checking on what is dead among the newly planted trees, though Brian said nothing would be done about these until Spring. There is no information on replanting before winter to prevent erosion.

9. New Business:
 - a. Dry Creek Trail Draft EIR public comment period for the Notice of Preparation of the Draft Environmental Impact Report: Initial planning is over. The City is now working on drafting the initial statement. There will be a meeting on December 3rd from 6-8 PM at Maidu Community Center addressing the draft, offering time for questions and comments.

10. Announcements and Remarks: Geoff will be gone from the 7th and will need coverage for his route. David A. needs a new block captain and apparently there is still one volunteer available. He will also check into a problem with a house in his area getting two copies.
