3. Police Report: Officer Hays provided the following information.

- a. There is an increase in catalytic converter thefts on six different nights this month. It is hard to prevent this as it occurs in the early hours of the morning. All were Toyota SUVs and parked on the street.
- b. The problem houses on East Colonial Parkway were discussed including the issue of the neighbors taking action against the owner of the one home. The four neighbors noted above were all tied to the neighborhood around this house. The vacant house is owned by a company in India. Our recommendation was for the homeowners to contact Cal Walsted and get his input into what action they should take.

5. Treasurer's report: The beginning April balance was \$1,943.14. The ending balance is \$2,853.44. The increase reflects Garage Sale activity.

Current project in process:

Club Maidu, is a reading group established about 14 years ago, by a former Roseville Librarian. We have been 'self-run' for several years now. During the course of the last three-four years we have grown from 10 to 22 members. A good number for a discussion group is about 8 or so. We recently obtained permission for two more time slots to expand into three groups. Our last 'all member' meeting will be May 3; the first split will occur with our June 7 meetings. The next split is planned for September.

We continued to absorb new members as time went along resulting with 17-18 people discussing books in our, one-hour time frame. We have a dynamic group, and folks are passing the word. However, we have lost people who would rather read something lighter, deeper, non-fiction, sci-fi, etc. I love that Maidu is a library of patrons who like to read and discuss. So the mission is one of meeting some more of these needs in specific and eclectic combinations.

In all fairness offers for me to expand reading groups at Riley, and Downtown have been offered. But, Maidu has so many people who would like to be part of a book group that expansion beyond the 95661 zip before these needs have been met has not been a priority for me.
