

Crime Corner

October was a tragic month for law enforcement officers in our area. The killing of Sacramento County Sheriff's Deputy Danny Oliver and Placer County Sheriff's Detective Michael David Davis Jr. were stark reminders of the dangers involved in keeping citizens safe. Our hearts and prayers go out to the families, friends and co-workers impacted by this violence.

If you followed the news that day, you know that many schools were locked down and roads blocked. When emergencies such as these occur, it's critical that impacted citizens be alerted ASAP if for no other reason than to stay away from the impacted areas. To improve how such alerts are communicated in Roseville, the City has launched Alert Roseville.

Alert Roseville is a an emergency notification system to which you subscribe. You control which types of alerts you want to receive, what impacted locations should trigger an alert (e.g. home, work, school, Uncle Ed's house, etc.) and how you want to be contacted, be it by phone, email, text or other option. It's a free service, but you must register on the City of Roseville web site. Search the Internet or the City's website (www.roseville.ca.us) for "Alert Roseville" and register today.

On the crime prevention front, our neighborhood officers shared important tips at a recent Maidu Neighborhood Association meeting. It's the holiday shopping season, so criminals will be on the lookout for an easy grab. Don't leave any valuables in your car when you go shopping. Better yet, leave them at home. If you must leave them in the car, hide them out of site, preferably in the trunk, BEFORE you arrive at your shopping destination. Carry your purchases with you rather than storing them in the car. If you have too many to carry, take them home.

With on-line shopping becoming more prevalent, thieves like to grab packages left at the front door. If you can't be home when the brown-suited Santa drops off your gift for Aunt Martha, ask a neighbor to pick it up. Another alternative is to use one of the delivery services provided by many of the major delivery companies. Some offer services such as hold for pick-up at a nearby shipping center, reschedule a delivery to a time when you will be home or deliver to an alternate address. Learn more and sign up at the carrier's web sites.
