

A New Neighbor Guide to The Garage Sale

If you moved here within the last nine months, you may be unaware of our Annual Garage Sale, our primary fund raiser. We publicize that our neighborhood is having a Garage Sale (approximately 100 homes participate each year) and people come from all over the area to buy your excess stuff. That's what the outsiders know. But now that you're an insider, here's how it works.

Each year we set a date on a spring Saturday when we think holidays and local events will not compete and the weather is likely to be neither too hot nor too cold. This year, for example, we've selected Saturday, April 25, the week after Earth Day. Next we make a proposal to you. If you would like to join us, we offer you the following services for a \$10 donation.

We will publicize the event via classified ads in local publications (Roseville Tribune, Sacramento Bee, and Pennysaver), and on Craigslist. We also announce the sale here in the newsletter, on our web site, on our Facebook page, and the Nextdoor site.

Our Sale-support-person-extraordinaire, Realtor Melinda Shrader, creates a Garage Sale packet which contains hints on running a garage sale and other supplies to get you started. We deliver it to your home once you've sent us your \$10 donation.

We hold a drawing and give away some neat prizes to garage sale participants on sale day. A week before the sale, we create a map of all the participating addresses in the neighborhood. We post this map on our web site, mention it in our classified ads for folks who want to get a copy online, and publicize it on our Facebook page.

On the day of the sale, our volunteers turn out to staff strategic street corners at the entrances to our neighborhood and hand out printed copies of the map to people as they drive into the neighborhood.

You may have read the good news that in 2014, the overall crime rate was down in Roseville. There are likely many contributing factors, one of which is Roseville Police Department's use of crime analysis. If you're not familiar, crime analysis is the review of crime data to identify crime hot spots and trends in order to predict what type, when and where crime is most likely to occur. Knowing this allows the police to deploy their resources more effectively.

For more details on crime analysis, join us for an in-depth presentation by Roseville PD's **Crime Analyst Jason Rudolph** at the February 24, Maidu Neighborhood Association meeting. Mr. Rudolph will provide an overview of the department and how they analyze crime data to turn it into information that the "feet on the street" can use to help them fight crime.

Safety While Walking.

Three pedestrians have been killed while crossing the street in the city since the beginning of this year. Even when walking on sidewalks along well illuminated roads or crossing the street using a crosswalk, pedestrians need to take extreme care when crossing the road especially those with heavy traffic and multiple lanes. The following tips can help you cross safely.

Be Safe and Be Seen: Make yourself visible to drivers.

- Wear bright/light colored clothing and reflective materials.
- Carry a flashlight when walking at night.
- Cross the street in a well-lit area at night.
- Stand clear of buses, hedges, parked cars, or other obstacles before crossing so drivers can see you.

Be Smart and Alert: Avoid dangerous behaviors.

- Always walk on the sidewalk. If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic.
- Stay sober; walking while impaired increases your chance of being struck.
- Don't assume vehicles will stop. Make eye contact with drivers, don't just look at the vehicle. If a driver is on a cell phone, he or she may not be paying enough attention to drive safely.
- Don't rely solely on pedestrian signals. Look before you cross the road.
- Be alert to engine noise or backup lights on cars when in parking lots and near on-street parking spaces.

Be Careful at Crossings: Look before you step.

- Cross streets at marked crosswalks or intersections, if possible.
- Obey traffic signals such as WALK/DON'T WALK signs.
- Look left, right, and left again before crossing a street.
- Watch for turning vehicles. Make sure the driver sees you and will stop for you.
- Look across ALL lanes you must cross and visually clear each lane before proceeding. Even if
 one motorist stops, do not presume drivers in other lanes can see you and will stop for you.
 Don't wear headphones or talk on a cell phone while crossing.
