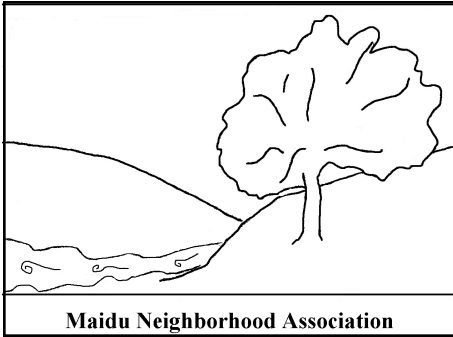

## How the Library CD Cabinet Donation Came to Be

As announced on Page 1 in this newsletter, the Maidu Neighborhood Association is donating a CD storage cabinet for use by patrons of the Maidu Branch of the Roseville Public Library. But how did that come to be?



Each year the Association raises money through our Neighborhood Garage Sale. A reserve is kept in case we lose our newsletter sponsor so we can keep publishing the newsletter, keep sponsoring our web site, and keep up with other periodic expenses. If we have additional funds, we consider a gift to benefit our community. Because we have a newsletter sponsor, Melinda Shrader, to support our publication, we have some discretionary funds on hand.

This year we sought to make a donation to Maidu Library. Our neighbor, Fran Webb, who gives us frequent Library updates, spoke with the Maidu Branch staff about what they needed. A number of needs were identified, including the following: Upgraded display case, new children's furniture or new covering for existing furniture, new bookcase for the book club kits, or better lighting along a back wall.

What quickly emerged, however, is that the existing CD Cabinet created some challenges. For one, it could store only 300 CDs, not all the CDs the library has in its collection, so patrons couldn't see all the Library had to offer. Another was that its lowest shelf was only 18 inches off the floor, making it difficult for many patrons to access easily. But a new cabinet from a catalog would cost \$2,750 to \$3,350 and would have similar design issues as the existing one.

So our neighbor Fran and husband Ken looked for alternatives. They found a local cabinet maker who, while not within our Association boundaries, liked the Maidu Library best. As long as he could be anonymous about his donation, he was willing to donate his labor if the Association would pick-up the tab for the \$600 in materials. The Association Board reviewed his design and agreed to fund the project. The new CD cabinet has several design features that will make it superior to the old one: Its eight CD drawers will allow the Library to make all of its collection available with storage for 900 to 1,200 discs. The lowest CD drawers will be much easier to reach. Under the CD drawers, there is now space for two additional large drawers that solve another of the Library's challenges, where to store the Book Club Kits. The 24' x 72" top of the cabinet will allow staff more display area to draw attention to current events and offerings.

This cabinet will benefit patrons and Library Staff. The construction is on schedule, and the Library has hired a mover to be ready to deliver it when it is finished. The Association Board hopes you agree this is a worthwhile investment for our neighborhood, and that you'll come see it either at its February 2 dedication, or some time after it is installed.
