

For your \$10 donation, you get coordinated advertising in the Sacramento Bee, the Pennysaver, on Craigslist, Facebook and our web site. Every home that signs up will be included on a custom-designed garage sale map posted on our web site and handed out at multiple neighborhood entrances that day. You get balloons to attract buyers, garage sale signs in a garage sale kit with selling tips, price tags and more delivered to your home by our neighborhood association sponsor, Melinda Shrader of Coldwell Banker Real Estate.

Registering also enters you in the garage sale raffle. We awarded a bunch of great prizes last year and will do so again this year.

Many of our raffle prizes come from Maidu neighbors. **If you would like some great advertising for your business, consider donating a raffle prize.** Donors will be mentioned in our neighborhood newsletter and in the garage sale kits. Are you interested in learning more about the Dry Creek Greenway Multi-Use Trail that will be built in our neighborhood sometime in the next decade? Then drop in on the workshop meeting at the Maidu Community Center on March 21, between 6 and 8 pm.

In addition to a brief presentation at 6:30, this meeting will allow you to review several exhibits providing maps, trail cross-section drawings, illustrations of the bridges to be used, and other aids to help you understand exactly what is contemplated.
