

Neighborhood Watch Program:

You may be concerned about the incidents of crime in our neighborhood, such as house and car burglaries, bike thefts, etc., and may want to do more to protect your property and that of your neighbors. Forming a Neighborhood Watch group may be that something extra that could help you and your close-by neighbors feel more secure.

“Neighborhood Watch is a crime prevention program that enlists the active participation of residents, in cooperation with law enforcement, to reduce crime in their communities.”

By forming a Neighborhood Watch group, you get to know your neighbors that live near you, agree to become more aware of what is going on in your neighborhood, and be willing to work together to make your home a safer place to live. The formation of the group must start with a volunteer who contacts the Neighborhood Watch Coordinator at the Roseville Police Department to set up your first meeting and to coordinate subsequent meetings in the future. At the Neighborhood Watch meetings, you will learn how to recognize suspicious activity, how to protect your family and your property, and how to keep an eye on your neighbors as well. Neighborhood Watch can help to reduce crime .

Guide Lines for Neighborhood Ads in Maidu Newsletter:

Are you thinking about advertising your business in the Maidu Newsletter? If so, following are the guidelines for publishing your ad.

1. Limit 1 ad of 3 lines per newsletter.
2. First come; first served.
3. No ad can be in the newsletter 2 months in a row and no ad more than 3 times per calendar year.
4. No realtor ads because our newsletter sponsor is a realtor.
5. Ads limited to space available.
6. Neighborhood Association Board has the final say on all ads.
7. You must live within the neighborhood to advertise your business in the newsletter or your business must be located within the neighborhood.
