

## Yomen, a Spring Event, at the Maidu Museum & Historic Site

The Maidu Yomen spring event will be held Sunday, April 27, at 1970 Johnson Ranch Drive at the Maidu Museum & Historic Site from 10 am until 3 pm. It is a celebration of the natural cycles of the earth by the local Native Peoples. Throughout the morning and afternoon of this event, various California Indian traditionalists provide dancing, storytelling, and singing to celebrate the coming of spring, a welcome time of new growth and the guarantee of fresh foods and warmer weather. There is no charge for attendance.

Explore the Historic Site with guided tours every hour. Petroglyphs, hundreds of bedrock mortars, and a large midden area illustrate the story of the Nisenan Maidu People who thrived on this land.

Children's activities include flute and bracelet making, petroglyph rubbings, soapstone carving, and acorn grinding. Live animals will be on display. The Museum itself provides a glimpse into the cultural and material life of the Maidu Peoples with dozens of exhibits and interactive displays.

Throughout the museum, demonstrators show how traditional skills are still being practiced, creating tools and crafts that would provide all life's needs in a Maidu village. In the shade of an ancient oak, traditional Native artists exhibit their unique items for sale.

Beverages and treats, including Indian tacos, will be for sale. Call 774-5934 for more information.

## Speaker from the City Explains Water Crisis

Have you had water and weather on your mind lately? At our last meeting, City representative Sean Bigley explained our current water situation and answered questions from the audience. Sean Bigley, Government Relations Analyst, is the City's point man on the water crisis. His good news: With the recent rain and mandatory water conservation, the City projects we will not run out of water this summer. The less favorable news is that conservation will have to continue.

Bigley explained that for almost all of Roseville, except for a few homes actually supplied by other water districts, Folsom Lake is the primary source of our water. In January the water levels came dangerously close to falling below the City's water system intake pipe at Folsom Dam. This led to the mandatory conservation, and the start-up of the City's reserve wells.

The wells were shut off after late rains partially refilled Folsom Lake. Unfortunately, the late rains, being generally warmer, did not substantially add to our snowpack in the mountains which normally get us through summer and fall.

Bigley also volunteered how to know if you are meeting the mandatory water conservation requirements. The question everyone has is, "How do we know if we are meeting the 20% water reduction requirement?"

The first step is to compare current use against that from the last two years during the same period of time. The City's free 'Water Insight' program can help you monitor your use and provide ideas for conservation. It shows you how you are doing compared to the average Roseville home of the same size as yours. You may enroll at [roseville.waterinsight.com](http://roseville.waterinsight.com).

If you are already conserving water, and your use is not in the higher tiers on your water bill, then the City is not likely to contact you. "We're working from reports of the tier 4 users, the highest water users, and contacting them. When we reach them, we try to see what's up and whether they are doing all they can to conserve, or not. We recognize people have a large investment in their landscapes."

There are no plans for only allowing watering certain days of the week. Bigley noted that while that would make enforcement easier, the City prefers to set a goal, then help residents figure out how to get to it. The City does accept reports of wasted water (water in the gutter is the primary sign). If you report waste, the City needs to know the day, time and place you saw it. They then need to see it for themselves before they can take action.

The next meeting of the Maidu Neighborhood Association will be held Tuesday, **April 22, 2014**, at 7 pm at Sargeant Elementary School, Activity Room, 1200 Ridgecrest, Roseville. The Activity Room is toward the back of the school. Enter off N. Cirby. We invite you to attend. A Roseville Police Officer will give a crime report at each meeting.
