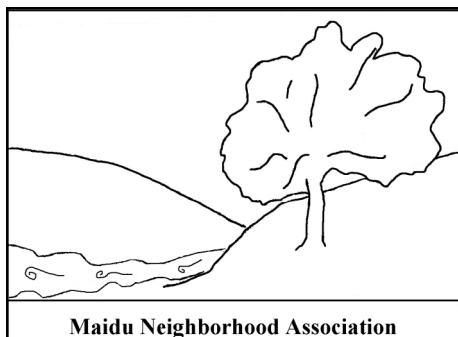

### Old Auburn Speed Limit Increase

Jana Cervantes, Roseville City Traffic Engineer, attended our May meeting and explained why the speed limit on Old Auburn from the eastern City limits to Cirby Way needs to be raised to 45 mph. Currently, the speed limit is 40 mph.

“California law requires that we re-survey every 5, 7, or 10 years depending on roadway changes in order for it to be radar enforceable. We’ve extended the survey as long as we can (10 years),” said Cervantes.

“The law has changed since we surveyed over 10 years ago. In addition to all the additional regulations, we used to measure the 85th percentile speed and round down. However, the law has changed to require rounding to the nearest 5 mph speed.”

“The previously-measured 85th percentile speed (being the speed which no more than 15% of traffic is exceeding) was 49.9 which meant we could round down to 45 and then reduce another 5 mph for conditions not apparent to motorists. This gave us our 40 mph speed limit,” noted Cervantes.

She continued, “When we measured it this time, it was a little over 48 mph. However, because of the new law, we have to round to the nearest 5 mph increment which gives us a starting value of 50 mph and we can drop it an additional 5 mph to get our new proposed limit of 45 mph.”

The Public Works Department plans on taking the speed limit update to City Council on June 18. This is an ordinance change so it has to have 2 readings and then it will go into effect 30 days after the second reading which would tentatively be August 1. The new speed limit wouldn’t start being enforced until the new signs are installed.

## Dogs and Maidu Park

Maidu Park and the open space on West Colonial are great resources and wonderful parts of our neighborhood, but there is much “doggie doo-doo” around Maidu, on its bike trail, and on W. Colonial trails. Please carry a doggie bag with you when you walk your dog anywhere in the neighborhood. It is the law to carry bags and pick up dog defecation. If you forget your bags, please use the ones provided by the City at the six bag stations around the park or the one bag station at the open space. The following is the Municipal Code regarding leashes and removal of feces:

### 1. 7.12.010 Leash law.

No person shall permit or allow any dog to run at large. This section may be cited as the “leash law.”

### 2. 7.14.010 Removal of dog defecation.

A. It is unlawful for the owner or person having the custody of any dog to fail to immediately remove and dispose of in a sanitary manner, by placing in a closed or sealed container and depositing in a trash receptacle, any feces deposited by such dog upon public property or upon private property not owned or controlled by the owner or person having the custody of such dog.

B. Any person who has the charge or control of any dog, shall have in his or her possession a suitable wrapper, bag or container for the purpose of complying with the requirements of this section. The failure of any person to carry such a wrapper, bag or container when in charge or control of any dog shall constitute a violation of this section.
