

The Maidu NA will be serving hot chocolate, cider, and cookies at Williard Deitrich Park at the corner of Stoney Point and N. Cirby. We plan to assemble at 6:15 pm. Santa will stop at the park entrance to wave and say hello. Please join us for a neighborhood gathering and enjoy a hot beverage. Look for the candle-lit luminarias at the park entrance. Rain cancels as this is an outdoor event.

On Saturday, December 10, the Roseville Coalition of Neighborhood Association's (RCONA) annual Santa in the Park event will take place at Roseville Sports Center at Mahany Park, 1545 Pleasant Grove Boulevard, from 1 to 4:30 pm. Santa will be arriving on a Roseville Fire Truck at 1:30 pm. There will be cup cakes, cookies, punch, carolers and crafts. It is a free event. The All Nations Native Craft Fair will be held on Saturday, December 3, from 10 am to 3 pm at the Maidu Activity Center (adjacent to the Maidu Museum). Native American artisans from California tribes and the Cherokee Nation will be selling contemporary jewelry, basketry, and other handmade crafts from traditional materials. Live music will be performed by Native American musicians at the event. Admission and parking are free. Event will be held rain or shine.

Just a short walk away, the very popular and festive Annual Holiday Craft Fair is also held on Saturday, December 3. It is open from 9 am to 4 pm at the Maidu Community Center, 1550 Maidu Drive. Admission and parking are free. This event is held rain or shine.

Great news! The US Department of Justice recently indicted individuals in the US over an IRS scam that plagued US citizens and netted in the neighborhood of \$250 million over the past few years. They are also seeking to extradite individuals from India where the calls originated. Scammers would impersonate IRS agents and demand immediate payment in money cards or wire transfers, threatening arrest if you did not comply.

It serves as an important reminder to always check with a trusted individual or the authorities before you send money solicited via phone or email to anyone. No matter how real it seems, check first. There's no shame in calling a friend, relative, or the police. Be cautious.

Holiday Shopping Security

The holiday shopping season is rapidly approaching. Here are some steps for trouble-free shopping.

If shopping online, minimize the likelihood of having a package left at the front door grow legs. If you can't be home when a package arrives, ask a neighbor to pick it up. Another alternative is to use one of the delivery services provided by the major delivery companies like "hold for pick-up" at one of their facilities, reschedule a delivery to a time when you will be home or deliver to an alternate address. Learn more and sign up at the carrier's website. Likewise, some online retailers that also have a retail outlet nearby offer deliver-to-store. You might save on shipping, too.

If you'll be heading to the stores, leave anything of value at home so your car doesn't become a target of thieves. If you have more than one stop, hide what you bought before leaving the parking lot so that you don't tip off thieves at your next destination. An alternative is to carry your purchases with you rather than storing them in the car. If you have too many to carry, take them home.
