3. Police Report:

- a. Things have been quieter since the holidays. There were a number of thefts of packages from doorsteps before Christmas. Three suspects were caught. There continue to be incidents of cars being broken into. There has also been a recent wave of vandalism in the Maidu area (e.g. broken car window on Thistle Down) which may be related to a possible suspect from Oakmont High School which the School Resource Officer identified.
- b. We let Officer Lackl know that we would like to recognize Lt. Cal Walstad. He will ask his supervisor, Jeff Kool, for suggestions on how to do so. Officer Lackl will send the info to Scott. Some ideas that were discussed include recognition at a public meeting (e.g. MNA meeting, City Council meeting), some sort of food item. Need to know if there is a monetary value limit.
- c. The question came up as to what are appropriate steps to take when observing a crime. Officer Lackl recommended recording the following: license plate number, type and color of vehicle, any distinguishing marks on the vehicle, description of suspect including gender, race and what they are wearing. 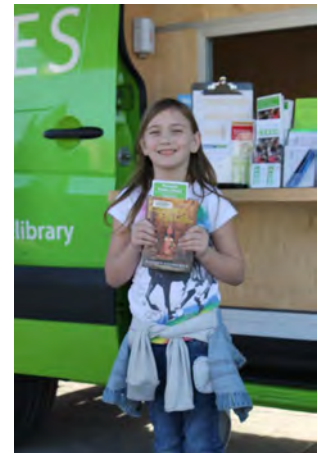
