3. Police Report:

- a. Mail Box Thefts have continued to be somewhat of a problem. The recommendation continues to be knowing one's neighbors and being aware of what's going on around you.
- b. Thefts from vehicles are also more of a problem with Spring. Cars are left out in front of homes and left unlocked allowing for thefts of opportunity.
- c. The new Security Camera registration program helps the police. If an event occurs in the area of a registered camera there may be possible useful evidence on the video. Check out the Police Department website for registration information.

4. Fire Department Report:

- a. Vial of Life Program — This program allows for medical information storage in the home so in case of an emergency the Fire Department can have access it vital data. The key info is written down on a sheet put in a bottle and put in refrigerator. A decal is then placed in the window noting the availability of the data. The Vial of Life Program bottles are available free of charge at local fire stations and at the Senior Desk at the Maidu Community Center.

Mary suggested the department might want to consider making the bottles available at the library. This might increase what is currently inadequate usage of the program. Information on the program is available on Fire Department Website.

- b. Lockbox Program — The department is also suggesting putting a lock box on the door of one's home and provide the box code to the Fire Department. This allows for assistance to individuals such as a frail adult or someone with an existing health condition requiring emergency care but unable to get to the door. This prevents wasted time (maybe lifesaving moments) trying to find a way in without breaking a door or window for access.

The lockbox number can be registered with services such as Life Alert who would pass it on to emergency services when called out. The number can also be given to dispatch when calling in an emergency.

5. Minutes of Previous Meeting:

Motion BM 4/17-1: Motion: The March minutes be approved – Ken moved, Fran seconded, Approved.

6. Treasurer's Report: The beginning March balance was \$1,619.71. The ending April balance is \$2,159.71.

7. RCONA:

- a. Carol Garcia — Community First Bank is a sponsor of RCONA and has offered to take over all RCONA bank accounts with no charges. This comes out of problems with US Bank which is not charging the individual NAs (although not us for some reason according to May). Jim needs our direction to know how to vote regarding the change.

Motion BM 4/17-2: Motion: To vote no on the change of banks. – Mary moved, David seconded. The motion was defeated on a 5 to 4 vote.

- b. Information on Engage Roseville. A Citizens Commission is being developed to review the budget for 2017/2018 and its priorities. This is because the budget as it currently stands it is in a deficit position.
- c. Changing Printers?: The flyers for Movie in the Park are better quality and less expensive than in the past. They are being produced by Lighthouse Printing. Jim passed on this information
- d. We will be working First Friday on June 2nd at the Fountains. Jim and Shirley will be covering the first shift and Vickie and Geoff the second.

8. Old Business:

- a. Website Sub-Committee Report: The change over is scheduled for May 6th or 7th and then David A. will take over as the webmaster. Scott's focus will continue on the newsletter.
- b. Garage Sale Planning Updates: Currently there are 78 participants.

 - iv. David A. will follow up on the advertising tomorrow.

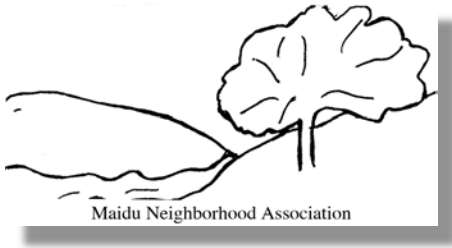
- v. Scott will send the map to Melinda and Geoff.
