3. Police Report:
 - a. A drug arrest was recently made at Maidu Park on methamphetamines charges.
 - b. Recently there has been an increase in car thefts. Specifically a late model 92 Honda Civic was stolen in our area and the Task Force is recommending owners use the Club as a deterrent.
 - c. There has also been an increase in IRS phone scams. Recommendations include not returning any calls to supposed IRS contacts. If a caller claims to be from the IRS hang up.

6. Treasurer's Report: The beginning May balance was \$2,278.03. The ending May balance is \$2,269.40.

7. RCONA:

- a. RCONA is sponsoring the 5k Fun Run at Royer Park. Some volunteers are needed to distribute water and bananas. The event takes place on July 4th from 6:30 to 9:00 AM

9. Old Business:

- a. Website Sub-committee Report: Scott and David met to discuss the topic. David proposed that instead of continuing to pay for domain names we don't renew them. Geoff suggested we check into the cost of keeping them and David will look into it.
- b. Sargeant School Thank You: Two suggested opportunities were suggested: 1. More books for advanced readers at the Library. 2. Robot kit for helping the kids learn to write code. We will readdress the topic at the August Meeting after NNO.
- c. Reminder of July Board Meeting Location: Next month we will again meet at Meadow Oaks of Roseville.
- d. National Night Out, Tuesday August 2nd: Jim has completed all paper work for both use of the part and for receiving the \$100 from RCONA.

Lance has made arrangements with DJ, The fee remains \$100. He hasn't gotten any interest from the restaurants in the area. He is contacting new businesses in the area such as the indoor skydiving. He is also going to create a flyer for businesses to contact him if they're interested.

Geoff reported that he is following up with the Indian Museum and Sprouts. He will send a follow-up to the Indian Museum and at Lance's suggestion will also contact the director of Park and Rec. (see attached)

Kona Ice Truck wants to come and sell snow cones and we told Jim that's fine. He also suggested contacting Top Golf, a new venue in the area, and Lance will follow-up.

10. New Business:

- a. Dan and Liz Johnson noted that people have been added to the Neighborhood Watch Group close to the North Cirby and Thistle Down area. They reported that the neighborhood watch sign is essentially old and faded and requested that we assist in getting a new one. The cost \$40 would be shared by us and the city.

Motion BM 6/16-2: Motion to pay \$20 towards the sign. Lance moved, Mary seconded, approved.

- b. The Johnsons pointed out that they had observed in the past in our neighborhood that dumpsters were placed within the community as part of a clean up opportunity. They wanted to know if this could be done again. It was suggested that a sub-committee be formed to look into this.


