

For truly unique gifts, come to the Maidu Museum & Historic Site's *All Nations Native Craft Fair* Saturday, December 2, from 10am - 3pm. There will be jewelry, basketry, handmade crafts and more. Over 20 Native American artisans from California tribes and the Cherokee Nation will attend. Enjoy free entertainment while you shop — tribal drumming, traditional music and singing This Craft Fair will be at the Maidu Activity Center (between Maidu Elementary School and the Maidu Museum).

28th Annual Holiday Craft Fair

Starting an hour earlier at 9 a.m. and also running until 3 p.m. at the Community Center in the Park, there is another large craft fair. If past sales are any indication it will have over 160 exhibitors lining the main halls and rooms and spilling outside on three sides of the building. You can find many individually crafted items including home décor, art, pet items, knitted and quilted creations, jewelry, unique crafts, specialty items, and gourmet foods. Enjoy the day as you stroll aisle to aisle discovering treasures at each stop.
