1. Meeting called to order at: 7:05 AM
2. Sign in/Welcome
3. Police Report: None
4. Guest Speaker: Willy Duncan: (see attached) He spoke to the importance of Measure E. He started by identifying all the school does. He emphasized the work they do with veterans, having a veteran center that serves over 1,000 veterans on campus.
 - a. The school provides career training with 29 different programs.
 - b. The school transfers students to Sacramento State, CA State University Campuses, etc. They have the highest transfer rates of any school.
 - c. There is an Ollie Life Long Learning program for those over 55. The school also provides a Kaleidoscope program which has numerous adult programs.
 - d. There hasn't been a bond measure since 1957 which is why Measure 55 is now needed.
 - e. 3.5 million is spent yearly to maintain the buildings but the infrastructure is in need of serious work.
 - f. A public safety building will be added because services are currently spread around the community. This will move some of the training into one area providing from more training for police, fire and first responders.
 - g. Part of the purpose of the Measure is to move the campus more to the north moving closer to Serra College Blvd. and away from Highway 80. Bring class rooms and labs, especially the science building, up to code. Expand the veterans program.

- h. The state wants less involvement in building and maintaining schools. It isn't even allowing funds already allocated to schools to be used.
- i. Additional funds will be raised from selling off a certain amount of land outside of the campus. This involves 72 acres across Sierra College from the campus and 32 Acres across from school on Rocklin Rd. This land will be used for home and commercial construction. The school will co-own the commercial property to generate future income and the school will also keep a parcel.
- j. The maximum any bond can be is \$25 per 100,000 of assessed value of a property. Measure E is only asking for \$17 rather than \$25. This works out, based on average property values to about \$5 per month. The return on this to the community could be over 1 billion from dollars coming to the community. The intent is to keep contractors and subs local if possible.
- k. The dollars generated by the measure are only to go to the infrastructure. All funds stay local and the state cannot get its hands on it.

5. Minutes of Previous Meeting:

Motion BM 5/18-1: Motion: The April minutes be approved. Dave moved, Scott seconded. Approved.

6. Treasurer's Report: The ending March balance was \$1,488.81. The May balance as of this date is \$2,175.98

7. RCONA:

- a. We need another volunteer for Downtown Tuesday night because Ken will not be able to participate. Vicki volunteered and will work the first shift with Geoff.
- b. Movie in the Park: Scott will help along with the Winters Family.
- c. RCONA will be doing a night of baseball for volunteers which means all NA board members are invited. The cost is \$16. It will be on July 15th at 6:06 PM at McBean Park in Lincoln. Anyone interested should contact Jim.

8. Old Business:

- a. National Night Out: We still don't know of the availability of Maidu Park Pavilion in September. Jim talked to Jeff at the Community Center. He said that as long as there isn't a 5k run it would be available. The second concern is that neither the police or fire departments can commit to their presence in September. Based on this second issue the board agreed that we will continue to have the event in August. The date of the event is therefore August 7th.
- b. Block Captain: Dave's neighbor might be willing to take the route. Dave will follow up to confirm but he is pretty sure the neighbor will be willing to take on the open route.


9. New Business:
