

Santa to Visit December 10th at Dietrich Park

It's official! Santa has announced he will be here, in our neighborhood, on Tuesday, December 10th. He will be assisted by Roseville Electric that will give him a tow, and escorted by the flashing lights and sirens of the Roseville Police and Fire Departments.

We will welcome him by holding a party at Willard Dietrich Park, right next to Sargeant School at the corner of North Cirby Way and Stoney Point Way. Join us there for hot chocolate, snacks, Starbucks coffee, or dinner from the Buck and Sadies food truck. Don't forget to drop off your letter to Santa!

Between 6:30 and 7 p.m., Santa's parade will arrive in the neighborhood starting at Boston Commons, then walk along E. Colonial Parkway, then turn on to Jamestown Way, and then turn right on Stoney Point Way. At this point he will reach Willard Dietrich Park where we will have our celebration! Since these times are estimated, we suggest being at the park at about 6:15 or so to get a good spot to see Santa, and to get a warm drink.

We expect him to slow down and take on a bag of letters from neighborhood kids (one of his elves will make sure they get in Santa's hands when he's home later that evening). So come join us in the Park and see Santa!

New this year, by special arrangement with Santa, we will be collecting letters to Santa in a mail box at Willard Dietrich Park the same evening he will be on parade. Join 2nd Tree Planting in Maidu Park on December 7th

The second of four tree plantings will take place in Maidu Park on Saturday, December 7th. The location hasn't been finalized, but will likely be next to the area where the November planting took place, i.e., just beyond the soccer fields in the undeveloped portion of the park. But watch for signs to direct you to the right spot.

The planting will start at 9 a.m. and run until 12:30. They will have gloves, or you can bring your own, and they will supply tools and refreshments. You will help plant 250 trees in pre-dug holes, installing tree shelters, stakes, and spreading lots of mulch to protect them.

As with last time, if you volunteer, the Roseville Urban Forest Foundation (RUFF) would really appreciate you letting them know you are coming (even in the last day or so) so they are sure to have enough tools and supplies. 

Last Chance for Input as City Moves to Districts for City Council

At our October Maidu Neighborhood Association monthly meeting at Sargeant School, the topic of City of Roseville proposed election changes for city council were discussed. The city is planning to change from electing five city council members at large (city wide) to electing five city council members by district. The city is moving forward with these changes by adding an ordinance (including rules and regulations) in order to conform with the California Voting Rights Act of 2001 (CVRA) which changed the California Constitution. The city is planning to transition to by-district elections for the 2020 general election.

The city has conducted public hearings, engaged in public outreach efforts, and received community input regarding the composition of city districts. Using community and city council input, 28 preliminary draft maps were initially drawn by the city's contracted demographer and made available for public review. As of this writing, there are seven proposed draft maps still under consideration, an example of which is shown above. The final hearing for public input is scheduled for November 20, 2019. Public input can also be sent via email to cityclerk@roseville.ca.us. The city expects to pay between \$35,000 to \$50,000 to incorporate these election changes with costs being absorbed by current contingency funds.



In all of the remaining seven draft maps, the entire existing Maidu Neighborhood boundaries are within one city district boundary. Five of the remaining draft maps combine the Maidu neighborhood with other neighborhoods east of Interstate 80 labeled as District 1 or as District 5. Two of the remaining draft maps combine the Maidu neighborhood with other neighborhoods east and west of Interstate 80 (Foothills Blvd.) as District 1 or as District 3.

There has been some confusion related to these changes on social media; therefore, Maidu neighbors are encouraged to get the facts from the city's website. Go to the City of Roseville website and search on, "Roseville Moves Towards District Based City Council Elections". The information dated August 28, 2019 will provide a clear and concise background for these changes along with other available information.

- **December**—*Santa in the Neighborhood Celebration at Willard Dietrich Park*. It’s a great night for families to get out and celebrate coming holidays. This event depends on the City of Roseville deciding to have Santa visit our neighborhood as they set the routes Santa will take each year. They announce the route usually on or about November 1st. - **April**—*Annual Neighborhood Garage Sale*. This is our biggest event with many neighborhood homes participating, and it is our primary fund-raiser.
- **August**—*National Night Out*. We join neighborhoods across the country in an event that highlights security through knowing your neighbors. We supply a meal or desert, and have family-fun activities.
- **October**—*Park Clean-up*. We want to keep the undeveloped parts of Maidu Park and other neighborhood open spaces clean so people don’t think they can freely litter in the area. We do the clean-up, then give volunteers a meal as a thank you for their help, and award a prize for the most unusual trash found. See our story above about our latest effort last month.
