May & June Junk Clean-up Events Need Volunteers

This spring the Roseville Coalition of Neighborhood Associations (RCONA) and the City will sponsor four neighborhood junk drop-off events including one in Maidu Park. The local one will be on Saturday, May 20th. Volunteers are needed to help run the events (you choose which ones to join).

Volunteers will help direct vehicles, check to see participants are Roseville residents, make sure folks understand what they can and cannot dump, and assist in dumping as needed. There are multiple shifts at each event that you may volunteer for. Volunteers will need to sign a waiver, and if you are a minor, you will need parental sign-off of your waiver. Volunteers will receive water and lunch.

All About Roseville Electric Including Rebates Available

At the February Maidu Neighborhood Association, Joe Song from Roseville Electric Utility gave an interesting and engaging presentation regarding energy generation and use in our city. Mr. Song presented:

- 1. an overview with many interesting facts about the City's power supply,
- 2. electrical rate increases (3% last month plus a temporary 8% increase in 2023-2024 largely due to external market price increases for natural gas), and
- 3. conservation programs and what neighbors should focus on to become more efficient electrical consumers while getting the best return on investment (including rebates).

Some highlights from Mr. Song's presentation are as follows:

The City of Roseville generates a significant portion of the City's electrical supply at the Roseville Energy Park in west Roseville by using two large natural gas fired turbines. The balance of the City's electrical needs is provided through contracts with other power agencies, residential solar units on new homes, plus solar that residents have added to older homes.

Since many homes in Roseville were built between the 1960s-1980s, energy conservation efforts can make a more significant positive difference in saving energy in the community. The city offers rebate programs to replace several home appliances such as, but not limited to, HVAC thermostats, window solar screens, and lighting to mention a few items (see picture, below).

When opportunities exist to upgrade numerous items in an older home, some replacements provide a better return on investment than others. For example, smart thermostats control a significant percentage of electrical use in homes since air conditioning and heating account for a larger portion of energy use.

Rebate programs are available as long as funds last. While some upgrades may cost more money, others cost much less by helping your existing systems operate more efficiently such as replacing HVAC filters every 60-90 days and replacing older light bulbs with LEDs.
