## Where the Spring Clean-up Locations Will Be

For the third year running, the City and the Roseville Coalition of Neighborhood Associations will be sponsoring Spring Clean-up events. Their purpose is to allow neighbors to get rid of items that won't fit in a trash can without having to drive all the way to the landfill in west Roseville. Unfortunately, unlike the past two years, one of the locations will NOT be Maidu Park. Last year the line of cars and trucks to dump at Maidu was so long it spilled onto Rocky Ridge Drive, creating a traffic jam and a potentially dangerous situation.

The locations will be as follows with Saugstad Park being the closest:

- April 20: Bridgeway Church, 8150 Industrial Avenue, near Roseville DMV
- May 4: St John's Church, 2351 Pleasant Grove Blvd
- May 18: Bridgeway Church, 8150 Industrial Avenue

#### RCONA Scholarship 2024 Deadline is February 29th

Each year our parent organization, the Roseville Coalition of Neighborhood Associations (RCONA) offers a \$300-or-more scholarship to a Roseville Joint High School district student planning to attend a 2 or 4-year college, or planning to get a vocational certificate. There are between 2 and 10 scholarships awarded each year.



For those applying this year, applications for the 2024 Sue Hallahan-Cook and Robert Sanchez RCONA Scholarship are open through Thursday February 29th. Applications must be postmarked or digitally turned in by the end of the day on February 29.

For those who may want to apply in future years, know that one of the unique requirements is that you show you worked as a volunteer for RCONA or one of its neighborhood associations, such as ours. #### **City Green Bin Audits Begin**

Let's start by saying what goes in your green-waste bin:

- Prunings (less than 4" in diameter and cut to fit inside)
- Leaves
- Grass clippings
- Fallen tree fruit
- Christmas trees (unflocked and cut to fit inside)

That, at least is the list on the City's web site. And it adds this plea:





The City just announced that it has begun green waste container audits across Roseville. You might spot City staff members inspecting green waste containers in your neighborhood. If they happen to identify unacceptable materials during their audit, a notice will be left on the customer's can to inform them of the problem. If the "contamination" of green waste is considered "moderate or extreme", the City may not empty your green can on your regular collection day. In any case, the notice on your can will tell you how to get in touch with the Waste Services Customer Service Team who will "guide customers" on how to fix things.

One trick we've learned over the years is to go to the Roseville City web site and search for "waste wizard." There you name what you are disposing, and the wizard responds with what you should do. For example, when entering "bark" as a search term, it says to bring it to the Western Placer Waste Management Authority Material Recovery Facility at 3033 Fiddyment Road, Lincoln CA.

## **Volunteer for Your Heath**

From *Kiplinger's Retirement Report*, October 2023, pp. 14-15:

"Volunteering in late life is associated with better cognitive function—specifically, better executive function and episodic memory—according to research presented at the Alzheimer's Association International Conference 2023.
