Deputy D.A. Speaks at Tuesday, March 26th Meeting

Supervising Deputy District Attorney Dan Wesp will attend our next meeting to speak about retail crime in Placer County. Retail theft, especially of the smash-and-grab variety, has received a lot of publicity lately thanks to store security videos of groups of people breaking into retail establishments and making off with merchandise.

Wesp will explain the role of the Placer County District Attorney's Office in prosecuting those crimes, and what their policies are on pursuing that prosecution. In addition to his role as a Supervising Deputy Attorney, Wesp has also served as the President of the Placer County Bar Association. He also lead as supervisor of the Placer County District Attorney's Office Special Prosecutions Unit which, last October, helped successfully prosecute a drug dealer for the fentanyl death of local Roseville teen, Jewel Wolf.


Woot Woot! All Aboard!

As is the case in all neighborhoods, especially one of our size (1200 homes), there are folks with talents and skills that go unnoticed to those around them. Tucked away in sewing rooms, craft rooms, garages, sheds, and backyards are treasures built by skilled hands and creative imaginations.

Hunkered down in the backyard of a neighbor, let's call him "Mark", is 750+ feet of track compiling a vast network of railroad lines. Mark had been a docent at the California State Railroad Museum 15 years ago and enjoyed getting kids into trains. COVID gave him down time to begin this awesome project.

The layout encompasses the entire backyard circling the edges, surrounding trees, and ducking under canopies and through mountains Mark has created. Sturdily built,

on the tracks without damaging them. 14 managing engines and tenders for the 84 car collection patrol the expanse of rails, dropping off cars and picking others up on sidings. Collisions are avoided during full operations by having members of Mark's club at several control panels strategically placed on the routes.

Features include two towns, each with stations, six water towers, and warehouses. Five industrial areas include Hume Lake Grainery, Klondyke Furniture Factory, Big Ol' Lumbermill accompanied by Woodlander Logging Operations, Dan's Railyard Ice House, Jackson Gold Mine, Lakehill Jail, Jon's general store, Nick's Hardware Store, a fire dept., and my favorite, a full switching yard! Farms include barns, windmills, and animals. The locations were named by Mark's kids to add authenticity to the family yard.

A retired electrical engineer, Mark has rigged Bluetooth access to the cars themselves and lights them up in seasonal colors for Halloween, Christmas, and Fourth of July. LED lighting accentuates the structures. Invitation-only open houses for friends, relatives, school groups, etc. put the magic on display replete with lots and lots of little people everywhere. To Mark, this takes effort, not work.

Please let the Maidu board know if there are other treasures tucked away that would be of interest. Seriously. We know you're out there.
