Monthly Meeting Minutes

February 2026

Date of Meeting: February 24, 2026

Time and Location of Meeting: Maidu Neighborhood Association (MNA) meeting called to order by President Mary Steele at 6:32 p.m. at Sargeant Elementary School.

Roseville Police Dept. Report:

Roseville Police Sargent Mike Ryland attended the meeting to provide an update regarding e-bikes in Roseville. Sargent Ryland provided a hand-out for attendees to reference during his presentation. He has worked for the Roseville Police Department for 23 years and informed attendees “the e-bike issue” exists everywhere (not limited to Roseville) and explained it’s a high-profile issue. Some of the big challenges are e-bikes are quiet and fast making it difficult to engage users if they flee from law enforcement (a felony). Pursuits are risky and normally involve “no-win” situations. Another issue is state laws are complicated. Two-thirds of Roseville e-bike accidents are kids not being safe but fortunately there has not been any fatalities in Roseville. The City of Rocklin and the school district there have banned all e-bikes from school properties. The City of Roseville is trying to work more effectively with school districts to educate kids and parents. The challenge for Roseville is there are more school districts involved. There are some rumors the state legislature is working on updating the laws that may require Class 2 users to be 18 years old (like class 3). Parents need to be more educated and emphasize to their children to obey related laws. Sargent Ryland will try to provide more e-bike updates at the

March MNA monthly meeting and began answering e-bike and other general questions from attendees.

RCONA report:

Jim Kidd reported the following topics related to Roseville Coalition of Neighborhood Associations (RCONA) activities:

- RCONA Spring Clean-Up schedules are posted and advertised in the City's electric billing statements. RCONA is asking all NA board members to volunteer and sign-up to help at one or more of the planned clean-up dates.
- RCONA grant funds up to \$2,000 are still available to participating RCONA neighborhood associations. The deadline for submitting applications is March 31, 2026. Jim reminded MNA Board members to think of ideas in which to prepare grant applications for funding.
- Jim presented information about new RCONA shirts for Board members which was discussed in further detail within the "New Business" agenda item.

Visitor Forum:

No new topics were presented.

Old Business:

Block Captain Dinner: The date for the dinner is scheduled at 6:15 pm prior to our monthly meeting on March 24, 2026 at Sargeant School. RSVP requests were distributed with the monthly newsletters (40-45 people are expected). As of the date of the monthly meeting, responses have been limited. Mary Steele asked for an update regarding catering. Lance provided information concerning three restaurants within the MNA boundaries at the Rocky Ridge Town Center. Dos Coyotes

provides a taco bar for \$9.50 per person which was within the target cost range. A motion was made and approved by the Board for a budget of \$500 and to acquire the food from Dos Coyotes. Mary Steele discussed tasks assignments. Shirley and Susie will coordinate set-up and decorations (Shirley to coordinate with Lance to get supplies from the U-Haul storage location); Jim will get a cake for dessert; Lance will place the Dos Coyotes food order and pick it up.

RCONA Sweet Celebration event 2026: Shirley reported giving a MNA check for \$250 to Jim (approved by the Board last month and payable to RCONA). Jim will reserve a table for eight people at the event. RCONA requested each NA to provide two prizes for raffle tickets at the event. Melinda agreed to coordinate raffle prizes to be donated.

New MNA form standardizing requests for business donations: Neighbor Connie Arkus submitted a draft version of the form which approval is not yet finalized. When complete, the form is to be used when contacting businesses (approved by RCONA) to seek donations for MNA events.

Annual MNA Neighborhood Garage Sale: The event date is set for May 2, 2026. Mary discussed task assignments including Jim following up with the city regarding posting our new banner from last year.

New Business:

New RCONA polo shirts: RCONA is offering optional short sleeved polo shirts with RCONA and NA logos. The goal of the shirts is to promote visibility for RCONA and help identify NA board members at future events. Shirts are available for a cost of \$20 each to participating NA boards. Jim indicated there was a short timeframe to order shirts from RCONA (deadline before our March meeting) and motioned the MNA to approve the cost for ten shirts. The Board approved a budget of \$200 to pay for shirts which prompted Jim to begin collecting shirt sizes from each Board member.

RCONA Election Fund Raising: RCONA is encouraging NAs to take advantage of funding opportunities by getting volunteers to provide support for upcoming mid-term elections in 2026. Like last time, training is required and shifts (2 choices/day) begin 11 days

before the official election date.
