March 2026

Date of Meeting: March 24, 2026

Roseville Police  
Dept. Report:

Roseville Police Sargent Mike Ryland provided a follow-up presentation from the February meeting regarding e-bikes in Roseville. Sargent Ryland also provided general updates on city growth, traffic enforcement and accidents, information about his 23-year professional experience, hiring status of a new patrol officer, and opportunities to address general questions and answers. A notable update pertained to traffic fatalities caused by people operating vehicles while driving under the influence (DUI) being charged and convicted of second-degree murder in Placer County. He provided an example where this happened. Ryland also noted that about 70% of vehicle and e-bike accidents are due to e-bike riders not obeying laws; however, there has been no fatalities within

Roseville as of this date. Some of the latest efforts to address e-bike issues include an educational push with Roseville school districts about the laws, proposed legislation, and license and permitting requirements. Focus will be with the middle schools back-to-school nights in the Fall of 2026. Educational efforts include age-appropriate videos of actual e-bike crashes and stories from Fire Department paramedics. Repeating what he told neighbors (the month before), e-motorcycles (no pedals) are not legal on any public property inside the City of Roseville and are frequently impounded by the Police. E-scooters require a permit or license to use and persons under the age of 18 must wear a helmet. There is pending legislation in Sacramento concerning Class 2 e-bikes. These changes would require riders to meet requirements associated with Class 3 e-bikes which require a minimum age and a license. Violators may be required to complete a Ride Smart program from the California Highway Patrol. Ryland also indicated the Police Department is developing an educational video to share with the public. The MNA Board requested a copy of the video when available.

Visitor Forum: No new topics were presented.

Old Business: Annual MNA Neighborhood Garage Sale: The event date is set for May 2, 2026. So far, nine neighbors have registered.

New Business: Block Captain Discussion: The level of participation at the Block Captain Recognition Dinner was less than expected. Scott provided an overview of the newsletter production and distribution process and methods of communications with Block Captains. Further discussion identified opportunities for improving processes and communications with Block Captains.
