Monthly Meeting Minutes

July 2026

Date of Meeting: July 28, 2026

Time and Location of Meeting: Maidu Neighborhood Association (MNA) meeting called to order by President Mary Steele at 6:37 p.m. at Round Table Pizza located at 8755 Sierra College Blvd. in Roseville due to unavailability of Sargeant Elementary School (summer recess).

Minutes from
prior meeting: Minutes from the June meeting were not approved due to the lack of a quorum of board members at the July meeting.

Treasurer's
Report: Shirley Brown was unable to attend the meeting but reported in advance the account balance at \$3,619.80.

RCONA report: On behalf of Jim Kidd who was unable to attend the meeting, Mary Steele reported the following topics from the scheduled board meeting for the Roseville Coalition of Neighborhood Associations (RCONA):

- RCONA created a sample laminated color sheet showing RCONA sponsors with logos to be displayed at future neighborhood events.
- The Roseville City Council plans to provide its annual “State of the City” presentation on August 20th 8:30 a.m. at the city’s new soccer complex. RCONA is asking for neighborhood representatives to attend the event with signs showing the neighborhood association name they represent.
- The League of Women Voters plans to hold a city council candidate forum in September. Details to be provided.
- Placer County elections officials are still accepting volunteers to staff the Voting Center to be located at Mahaney Park. RCONA receives financial contributions for volunteers which are then divided between a participating neighborhood association (60%) and RCONA (40%). The county is seeking a minimum of 40 volunteers. Advance training is required (even if a volunteer completed previous training).

Visitor Forum: No new topics were presented.

Old Business: National Night Out Preparations: (**Note:** a budget for this year’s NNO event on August 4th was set at \$600 using an e-mail vote on July 18th to provide more time for pre-event preparations). At the July 28th meeting, Mary Steele distributed a sheet of task assignments. The following tasks were assigned: Moody will get the ice chest from storage and dry ice and ice cream. Advertising to be coordinated by Mary Steele. The park space reservation and extending invitations for Police and Fire representatives was assigned to Jim Kidd. Securing company donations were assigned to Susie Williams and Mary Hoff. Coordinating the Taiko Drum performers and “Maidu Mustangs” classic car owners will be coordinated by Lance Hibben. Yard games to be coordinated by Moody and Lance. Exhibitors will be coordinated by Shirley Brown, Mary S. and Susie. The participant “sign-in” sheet and raffle will be managed by Mike Clayton. Decorations and set-up and take-down to involve everybody. Set-up begins at 6:00p.m. MNA Board members are asked to wear their black MNA Polo shirts.

Letter of Appreciation for City: Mary Steele has fine-tuned the Letter of Appreciation and will check with other RCONA

neighborhood associations to find out if they want to participate in presenting the letter to the city council at an upcoming council meeting. See last month's meeting minutes for more details.

Maidu Park Tree Removal: The recent unexpected removal of trees inside Maidu Park highlights once again the need for better communication between city park staff and MNA. Mary Steele proposed creating a liaison position for both the MNA Board and the City of Roseville Parks Recreation, and Libraries staff. Mary will check to determine if Scott Reid or Jim Kidd would be willing to serve as MNA's liaison.

Interview with New Police Chief: Mary Steele updated meeting attendees her plan to interview Roseville's new Police Chief, Jeff Beigh. Mary encouraged attendees to share any questions or topics of interest with her to include during her interview. Mary plans to share her experience and write a MNA newsletter article afterwards. Topics may include:

- Drug use trending lower
- Ongoing e-bike issues
- Department use of arial drones
- Homelessness updates
- Shoplifting crackdown

New Business: August Meeting Location: The location for our August monthly meeting was not discussed; however, after the meeting via e-mail, the Board decided to remain at Round Table Pizza again so that it could be published in the next newsletter. It is unclear who will contact the restaurant to reserve the space.

Annual Maidu Park Clean-Up: The date was set for Saturday, October 10th. A motion and vote to establish a budget could not be done due to lack of a quorum present at the meeting. Additional planning will resume at the August meeting.
